

Radcliff Leaf and Brush Pick-up

Beginning July 1, 2008, the City of Radcliff leaf and brush pick-up schedule will be **revised**. The schedule is as follows:

Revised Brush Pick-up Schedule: After July 22, 2008 (1 cycle thru the city)
After September 1, 2008 (1 cycle thru the city)
After April 15, 2009 (1 cycle thru the city)

Revised Leaf Pick-up Schedule: After October 15, 2008, continuing until two complete cycles of the city have been accomplished.

The City's leaf and brush pick-up service is intended for the assistance to homeowners and **is not** for the use of any persons engaged in the business of tree felling or landscaping for profit. It will be the responsibility of the homeowner to ensure persons hired to do this type of work remove their own debris.

GUIDELINES FOR LEAF AND BRUSH PICK-UP SERVICES

LEAF PICK-UP (by the City)

In order for the machinery to pick up the leaves, they must be placed alongside the street, but not on the street, within the boundary of the homeowner's property. The leaves may not contain any other material. This machinery is designed for leaves only – anything else can damage it. Piles that contain any other debris will not be accepted for pick-up.

BAGGED LEAVES (for pick-up by Waste Management)

If you wish, you may bag your leaves for Waste Management garbage service to pick up – limit of 15 bags - but again, the bags must contain only leaves – no other material. Please place your bagged leaves near the street where you place your household garbage for pick-up.

BRUSH PICK-UP

Tree limb debris or brush will be picked up – **not** the tree trunk or roots. Limbs and brush must be no longer than 12 feet in length and should be bundled in one direction, and placed near the street, but not on the street. Tree debris cannot contain any foreign material – if it does, it will not be picked up, and will have to wait until the next scheduled pick-up (see schedule above). Also, Waste Management garbage service will pick up small bundles of tree limbs – no longer than 3 – 4 feet in length and they must be tied into bundles.
